

Collaboration is key: Menzies Timor-Leste office celebrates fourth anniversary

The ongoing focus on collaboration by Menzies School of Research (Menzies) to sustainably building healthcare systems and health leadership capacity in Timor-Leste is being celebrated.

Today marks 4 years since Menzies established an office in the neighbouring country. The team continues to work in partnership with the Timor-Leste Government, key stakeholders and the people of Timor-Leste, to achieve better health outcomes.

Strong relationships and a focus on developing local evidence to inform and tailor infectious disease management and prevention have been the driver of many key achievements. This includes the country's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, better diagnosis of antibiotic resistant infections and growth of Timorese health leaders.

Menzies projects contributing to this include the now-completed <u>ARIA-RISE project</u>. The project provided data to inform the rates of COVID-19 and other vaccine preventable diseases (like measles, rubella, hepatitis B and dengue fever), and results have significantly influenced vaccination policies in Timor-Leste.

Another key project is <u>STRONG-TL</u>. The team has spent 5 years working with the Ministry of Health to strengthen the surveillance and control of infectious diseases in Timor-Leste, and evaluated the impact of this on health systems and policy responsiveness.

An important ongoing project is the <u>MATCH-TL project</u> (Malaria, Tuberculosis (TB), COVID-19, HIV diagnosis and surveillance in Timor-Leste). It continues to examine rates of infectious diseases in the country. Part of this work includes the National TB Prevalence Survey (NTPS) which is working with the National TB Program in all municipalities across Timor-Leste to better understand the true impact of TB in the country.

The <u>Fleming Fund Country Grant to Timor-Leste</u>, funded by UK Aid and managed by Mott MacDonald Group, supports work to tackle antimicrobial resistance. Menzies will continue working with partners to strengthen antimicrobial resistance surveillance through a One Health approach, which recognises the connection between humans, animals and the environment.
