licence that lasts for 6 or 12 months or a perpetual license. Additionally, there are 2 options for Stata: large (Stata/BE) and very large "Stata/SE", ("special edition"). **We recommend students purchase Stata/BE** as it can handle most of the datasets encountered in health research projects.

We recommend you use your student email and select the download option when making your selection. This takes up to 2 days to arrive via your student email.

Stata also offer a print copy of their very useful guide called A Gentle Introduction to Stata, revised 6th edition at a reduced price, which mut be ordered at the same time you order the software (optional - see options under 'Bundle a Stata Press Book' on the Stata order page).
