This 'Introduction to Biostatistics' Unit is a Stata GradPlan authorised course. This means that students may purchase Stata at a special student rate. Students must choose between purchasing a licence that lasts for 6 months or 12 months or a perpetual license. Stata comes in two different 'sizes': large (Stata/IC, where IC is short for "Intercooled") and very large ("Stata/SE", where SE is short for "special edition"). We recommend that you purchase Stata/IC as it can handle most of the datasets encountered in health research projects.

The lecturers in this unit use Stata 15 which was released in June 2017. However, students will need to purchase the most recent version, Stata 16, that was released in June 2019. There is minimal difference in the basic functions between the two versions. But if you have any issues with version difference please contact your lecturer.





There are a couple of other aspects you need to be aware of when ordering the student version. Please use your student email and select the download option when you are making your selection. This option only takes 1 to 2 days to arrive via your student email.

Stata also offer a print copy of their very useful guide called A Gentle introduction to Stata, 6th edition at a reduced price, provided you order it at the same time you order the software (**optional – see options under 'Bundle a Stata Press Book' on the Stata order page**).
