

HOT NORTH Honours Scholarship

Dear Applicant

Thank you for your interest in applying for the HOT NORTH Scholarship. The scholarship is for a student in an Honours program (or equivalent) who undertakes their research project in one of the following fields of research:

Skin Health; Respiratory Health; Antimicrobial Resistance; Chronic Diseases; Vector Borne and Emerging Diseases.

Scholarships are open to domestic students (Australian citizens and Permanent Residents) across Australia who have been accepted into an Honours program (or equivalent) at Charles Darwin University, James Cook University or the University of Western Australia.

HOT NORTH will select applicants using a competitive merit-based process.

The scholarship will be offered for one year (subject to satisfying course academic requirements) and will include a tax free living stipend of \$10,000. Scholarships stipends are paid fortnightly.

The Scholarship Panel will base their decisions on the following guidelines and criteria:

- a) Applicants will be ranked on academic merit.
- b) Careful consideration will be given to grade point average.
- c) Applicants must nominate a Chief Investigator or Associate Investigator in one of the HOT NORTH themes of Skin Health; Respiratory Health; Antimicrobial Resistance; Chronic Diseases; Vector Borne and Emerging Infectious Diseases as their Honours supervisor (see below for list of investigators).
- d) Publications and relevant work experience will be considered where they bear direct influence on the applicant's academic or research capacity.

Attendance at an interview is not required
