Wellbeing Intervention for Chronic Kidney Disease: A randomised controlled trial of the Stay Strong App



What is the WICKD Study?

We know that living with Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) can put stress on people not only because of the illness itself, but living away from home for treatment can often make people feel stressed or sad.

The WICKD study is a randomised controlled trial that address the mental health and wellbeing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people with CKD-stage 5. It brings together service providers from the Department of Health and Purple House and a team of wellbeing researchers.

WICKD will test the effectiveness of a culturally developed emental health intervention in improving mental health and wellbeing, quality of life and attendance to treatment for people with CKD. The study will also measure the cost effectiveness of considering/focusing on a wellbeing approach alongside medical treatment in CKD services.

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What will participants be asked to do?

People 18 years old or older and on haemodialysis for at least 6 months in Darwin or Alice Springs can take part in this study. Participants will be asked to:

- Complete 3 questionnaires about their life and how they feel 3 times.
- Talk with a researcher using a health app on a tablet device.
- Give permission for the researchers to review their medical files to obtain their medical history.

Participants will see researchers 4 – 6 times over 6 months.
